THE STEEPLE RESTORATION

River City Builders and Millworks Inc. completed a much-needed restoration of the steeple, the bell structure, the east window and the entry to the wooden church. A generous estate gift prompted the restoration work, but more funds are needed to cover the remaining costs of replacing beams, flooring, bell supports and lighting.

HAPPENINGS AT VALLEY GROVE




•Prairie burn: In early June wind and weather enabled Zumbro Valley Forestry Inc. to burn a portion of the prairie to maintain the native plants while suppressing invasive species. Periodic burns are an important activity in a healthy prairie and oak savanna ecosystem. The deep roots of prairie grasses and bur oaks withstand the surface fires and thrive on the increased fertility that follows.

- Celebration of Valley Grove weddings: On June 26 couples who had married at Valley Grove, or their children or parents before them, gathered to celebrate those memorable occasions with wedding photo albums, stories, and wedding portraits. A generous estate gift and investments paid for two-thirds of the much-needed repairs to the wooden church's steeple and entrance (see photos, page 1). We now turn to you to help us pay for the remainder of the restoration expenses with an extra generous donation. Donations in any amount will be **matched dollar for dollar**, if given

We also offer to especially generous donors an opportunity to "win" a **Tom Maakestad original painting!** Tom grew up near the

Valley Grove churches, which his parents John and Bobbie Maakestad helped preserve in the mid 1970s. An internationally known artist Tom (https://tommaakestad.com/oil-pastel-and-painting) has painted Valley Grove in many different seasons over the years. He is donating a framed 20x28" original painting as an incentive for donors to give a bit more.

If you donate \$1,000, you will receive one lottery ticket; donate \$5,000 and you will receive two tickets; \$10,000 warrants three tickets, and \$20,000 or more will increase your chances of taking home Tom's original Valley Grove painting four-fold with *four* tickets. The winning ticket will be selected at the January 8, 2025 board meeting and will be delivered to the winner.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN IN 2024 AND 2025



The Valley Grove tapestries, woven by Robbie LaFleur, will be back on the road during their "off" season. In November and December 2024 they will be exhibited at Hennepin Avenue United Methodist Church in Minneapolis. March and April 2025 the tapestries will head south to the Vesterheim Museum in Decorah, lowa as part of that Norwegian-American museum's celebration of the bicentennial celebration of the first

Norwegian settlers to land in the United States in 1825.

These traveling exhibits continue the intent to share the Valley Grove story with the wider community, as outlined in the grant we received from the Partners for Sacred Places to commission the tapestries.

The tapestries can also be found for sale in a packet of 8 notes cards (with envelopes) at the September Country Social for only \$10/packet.
